- Next to main reception, take the stairs down one level.

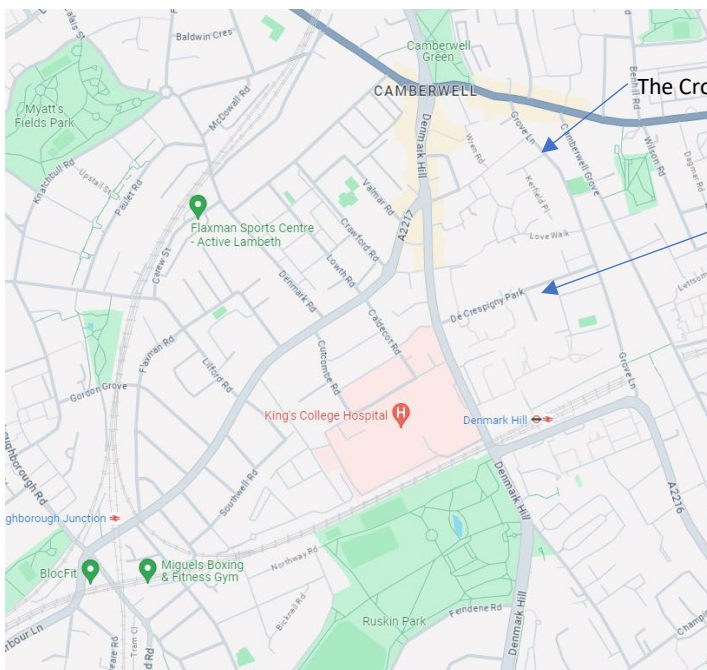
